AND ON TO GRAND ASSEMBLY 2012

Grand Assembly 2012 will be held at the Peppermill in Reno. The facility contract has been signed and we will sign meal contracts when we are much closer to eating! We will again be "self contained" at one location. While it is a wonderful experience to park the car and leave it until it's really time to go home, this luxury comes with some expense. Please begin now to do fund raising events earmarked to help the girls cover some of their expenses. Based on your expenses from Grand 2011, you should be able to make some good budgetary guestimations about next year's expenses... help your girls establish something where they can save their money with the assembly. **I always encourage assemblies to budget for a two year period - while we all attend Grand Assembly, most only have to TRAVEL once during the two-year period.**

Just as we do for Supreme Assembly, I suggest each assembly also consider a non-interest bearing "savings" account for girls and adults to help them set aside money for Grand Assembly. For example, if Susie has \$25.00 in September she would like to pay for her June expenses, take it, issue an appropriate receipt and hold on to it within your assembly checking account until it is time for Susie's expenses to be credited. If you consider doing this, be sure whomever is accounting for these funds has a really good process for recording them, and establish a minimum "savings" account deposit (you

probably don't want to get involved in this experience for \$2.00 per week, but \$25 per month – or \$25 in some months -- might be very helpful.

But AGAIN, look at fund raising events that will help offset **some** of these expenses to make it easier for our girls to attend. **THIS year**, we had over 350 registered guests – which is a really high number when our economy is good – and we all know we aren't enjoying much “good economy” these days! I hope we continue that growing trend for many years.... This continued growth to our organization and to the attendance numbers at Grand Assembly is one of the factors for changing venue in 2012 – we have simply outgrown Circus Circus!

The goal of our GAC 2012 is to have registration information ON OUR WEBSITE prior to Rainbow Camp - and will need it back no later than the specific dates they establish. The Hotel will established very firm deadlines we will need comply with. The website seems to be working well for this distribution of information.

AND SOME OTHER 2011-12 INFORMATION

Please let me know a couple weeks prior to your need - not because it takes that long to generate them, but because I usually need to mail them.....(and I have to be home to generate them!!!) I am also happy to send a blast... about events, installations, fund raising events, special meetings, etc.... I can send you a specific list of who is on my blast lists...so you don't spend postage on something we can get by email. *With the cost of postage (and everything else) rising, we need to continue to work smarter and that means we aren't in the printing business!!!* **Please remember that RSVP information is to an adult.... And that all invitations must come to me from a responsible adult – not your WA. I need to know her adults have blessed the invitation, that another set of adult eyes have seen it, that the “I’s” are dotted.... You get the picture!**

NEED REPLACEMENT PARAPHERNALIA?

Please remember, I do have some paraphernalia that may be in better shape than what you are currently using. Please “shop” in the Rainbow Storage Unit prior to purchasing something. For example, I have extra Bibles, Pot of Gold covers, gavels, flags, etc. **IF YOU NEED SOMETHING NOW, LET ME KNOW. I will be at the Supreme Temple later this fall for an SEB meeting – let me know if there are items you need that I can bring home for you –saving the cost of shipping.**

CALENDAR NOTES:

Please make an effort to get all your girls and adults to these and other functions throughout the year. This is a great way to promote attendance at the functions your assembly will host, to encourage friendships between girls and adults of different assemblies, and a little road trip is always a lot of fun! Again given RISING cost of travel this year, you may want to focus visitations for other-than-Grandies to local events... so when we are in the north, we would expect to see **every** northern member and adult - and in the south, the same..... **PLEASE REMEMBER the frustration at your events when you have 6 RSVP and 86 show up expecting to be fed!!!**

IF YOUR ASSEMBLY IS DRIVING (anywhere) – PLEASE REMEMBER THE ONE SEAT BELT PER PASSENGER RULE (ACTUALLY ITS STATE LAW).... WE DON'T WANT HARM TO COME TO OUR GIRLS/ADULTS BECAUSE ONE OF THE PASSENGERS WAS NOT BUCKLED IN AT ALL TIMES..... AND REMEMBER, OUR YOUNGER AND/OR SMALLER GIRLS NEED TO BE IN THE BACK SEAT... THEY ARE MUCH SAFER THERE ... PARTICULARLY IF THE VEHICLE HAS AIRBAGS. FAILURE ON ANY DRIVER'S PART TO FOLLOW THESE RULES WILL RESULT IN AN IMMEDIATE AND UGLY RESPONSE FROM ME.....

PLEASE REMIND OUR GIRLS AND ADULTS WE ARE A “NO-PHONE / NO-ELECTRONICS” ZONE ON RAINBOW TRIPS. ... THE NAVIGATOR SHOULD HAVE A CELL PHONE HANDY - ALL OTHER ELECTRONICS SHOULD BE STOWED FOR THE DURATION OF THE DRIVE -- PROMOTING RITUAL PRACTICE, CHATTING, BONDING, SINGING OF RAINBOW SONGS, ETC.... NOT NAPPING! *The Grandies will be firming up this area of our driving policy at Leadership....watch for enhancements.*

DON'T FORGET YOUR PARENTAL TRAVEL SLIPS/MEDICAL RELEASES BEFORE YOU LEAVE HOME – every time!

If you are sharing your Official Visit with another assembly, the process for planning is no different than if you were hosting your event alone. **The girls should be totally involved in the planning, in making decorations, designing the invitations, setting up, practice, and clean up....the whole event should reflect the talent of the girls!** Yes, most groups of girls will need some adult help, but we aren't teaching our girls anything if they don't have input and opportunity. If they show up on the day of the event, enjoy the meal the adults planned, cooked, and served, sit in their seats and listen to the introductions an adult wrote for the Worthy Advisor, enjoyed the decorations some pretty crafty adults made and hung - and go home - we have failed them - and they probably won't be back - for anything. Ownership is very important to all of us – regardless of our age – and **this is a girls' organization** – so ownership (and the work and pride) belongs to them!

This is also my annual reminder that Official Visits and Grand Officer Receptions are **not** equivalent to our daughter's wedding - or the coronation of the Queen! They are basically a two-hour opportunity to visit and to pay tribute.

- ✓ Meals should not be 7-course catered affairs, though the girls and adults should behave as if they are. Manners and proper etiquette are ALWAYS important.
- ✓ They do not need engraved invitations, though an invitation is appropriate - the computer generated ones (even those mailed without an envelope) or something cleverly done on post-card stock are just perfect. As long as they contain all the necessary information and they express the girls' ideas, no other fancies are necessary. Think creative email!!
- ✓ Decorations in the assembly room and in the dining room are also wonderful - as long as they are created and done by the girls - and are inexpensive. Some of the “best” decorations we have seen over the years are the ones drawn, colored, and hung by the girls – something from their imagination - not something adults spent countless hours or dollars finalizing!!
- ✓ **PLEASE BE SURE YOUR GROUP R.S.V.Pss** to THE HOSTING ASSEMBLY FOR ANY EVENT WHICH INCLUDES A MEAL. We want to keep our expenses reasonable and tossing a ton of unnecessary and unused food is not acceptable..... Assemblies should plan on “most” Grand Officers, most Grand Deputies and Directors, our State Rainbow Dad and me at every function.... and will then need the number of attendees from your assembly..... please be considerate.... and helpful in this area.

While the calendar is not yet finalized, please remember we potentially have seven receptions this spring – we may well see some marathon days – but with the learning experiences of last year – all should be smooth.

INSTALLATIONS

As you prepare for your installations, please remember a practice is always necessary. Be sure to allow sufficient time to ensure the participants are prepared and confident in their roles. Installing Officers should know their work - encourage the Presiding Officer to know her part - she will be that much closer to 4th Degree Proficient. A practice will ensure the marshal(s), etc., are confident in what they need to do - as well as the new officers of the assembly being confident in where they need to be, how they will get there, and how they need to behave. **Please remind your Marshal when using two where the “pause” point is (near the Observers) and how to get ready for the next escort (from a point close to Hope’s station)... using two marshals is designed to run more smoothly and save time -- when there are sufficient number of girls to install -- and they work effectively.**

PLEASE REMIND YOUR GRANDIES that if they are invited to assist with an Installation, it is an honor – that could easily have been given to any number of other girls... they are to be at Installation practice AND they are to follow the direction of THAT Grand Deputy in terms of floor work... **this is not an opportunity for them to take charge or to creatively accomplish the job!!!**

Also, the new officers should know the ritual work associated with their new appointment prior to Installation. During practice, many assemblies have individual officers prove their new work to an adult waiting on the sidelines during those times many of them are just sitting in their new station, without much to do. This maximizes use of time and utilizes the adults - be sure, however, that mother/fathers don't hear their own daughter's work!

Be sure your Installation itself is limited to 2 hours – from the posted starting time, to Rainbow Dreams! SO, first of all, **START ON TIME.**

“Our” attention is really not much longer than two hours, and with a little planning, it is pretty easy to stay within that limit - **even when awards are given out (which they should be).** Review what you are currently doing to see if you can streamline some of the presentation “stuff.” If you have Pledge Installation first, it should be immediately followed by the Assembly Installation – do not allow time for guests to leave following Pledge Installation – the girls need to quickly retire, reform at the doors, and return to the assembly room at the direction of the Presiding Officer, etc. If you have Pledge Installation, this should be accomplished in 15-20 minutes which still makes your entire function less than 2 ½ hours long. If your adults are doing the crowning ceremony – they don't need 10 minutes to regroup, grab flowers and re-enter.... Please work with them so this is a quick turn around for them too!

MEDIA RELEASE

NOW is a great time, as our web site is being updated with pictures from Grand 2011 -- and Chris is sending photos to SUPREME for their site -- to ensure you have a signed Media Release Authorization and Release Form - for ALL girls and adults. In reviewing my records, I STILL have very few of these forms.... Our process requires that each assembly retain either the original or a copy - and that I have either the original or a copy as the custodian of these records. We need to be in compliance with this important area -- to protect ourselves. Please assign an adult to get your assembly current - then institute a procedure where the parents sign this form at the time of the family interview, prior to Initiation. **Ultimately, while “delegate and accept” is appropriate here, I will look to each Assembly’s Grand Deputy to provide this documentation to me.**

QUICK REMINDERS

In no particular order, here are some of the tidbits you need to remember in the upcoming months:

- ✓ Service Hour information to Linda Hayes, Director. Be sure someone in your assembly has ACCEPTED this DELEGATED responsibility – it’s not the MA’s job to do the task, but to monitor its completion....
- ✓ LIKEWISE, Membership information should be submitted immediately following Initiations (or once each month) to either Camaran Doughty or Melanie Binum – AND added to your annual report - on line – so at the close of this year, 90% of that report is finished.... yeah!!! I actually get an auto notification so I KNOW when you are doing this!!!
- ✓ Adult Leadership - your input into the agenda would be most helpful - anytime. This is an agenda that is always being built and I welcome your input into making our time the most valuable. It is always the FIRST weekend in February ... CAMP is the SECOND weekend in March. Leadership will be our opportunity to ensure “our ducks are lined up....”
- ✓ Term calendars - Grand Deputies are responsible to ensure I receive yours.... email is fine! Once I get it, I will give it to Chris for the site if you have not already done so. This process also allows me time to provide the appropriate dispensations for open meetings, etc.
- ✓ Line officer duties should be divided among the line officers in an assembly - the Worthy Advisor should not be responsible for all aspects of the term: Charity should be responsible for fund raising, Faith for new member nurturing, Hope for ?. Please refer to your Line Officer Handbook within your Adult Workers Handbook for these specifics. **BE SURE the MA, AMA, and sometimes the GD are holding REGULAR line meetings....**
- ✓ Grand Hope and Grand Charity, as well as the Grand Worthy Advisor, will soon begin their fund raising events. When asked to buy something to support these causes, please do so - and encourage those around to do the same!
- ✓ **SECOND suspension notices** are due to be sent to those who have yet to pay their dues.

- ✓ At this point in the year, I am hopeful those who have yet to say their Obligation have done so --so they can receive the bars they have been earning.... and I am hopeful the Obligation is given at a regular meeting - at the altar.

As always, be sure to highlight / summarize the information in this and the Grand Officers' Newsletters and share it with the appropriate individuals on your Board and in your assembly. **I am happy to add these people to the e-blast system** - and save you this effort.

And lastly, my eternal appreciation to each of our adults – whether your role has a “real title” or you are a supportive parent sitting on the sideline cheering on the group as a whole.

While at Texas Grand Assembly, we attended their Youth Protection/Safety Seminar – designed for girls AND adults – these are my notes, comments and suggestions – many of which we should be incorporating into our experiences with our membership – on a “daily” basis.

Safety Moment of the Day: When the passenger releases his seat back to recline in the passenger's seat, the seatbelt (the shoulder portion) becomes useless. There was recently an accident wherein the **passenger** had been tired, reclined his seat, was involved in an accident and his seat belt, because of his reclining posture, was of no value to him. Upon impact, his body was projected into the dash of the car resulting in his death. Apparently car manufacturers have known of this deficit for years. *(As a Nevada note, this should not happen on any Nevada Rainbow trips as there is to be no sleeping....)*

Along this line, please ensure that ALL seatbelts are fastened CORRECTLY before starting the car, EVERYTIME! Some girls/adults are irritated by the shoulder part of the seatbelt and want to put it behind their body, utilizing only the lap part of the seat belt – this is NOT acceptable..... or safe.

When we talk about “protection,” some of the words that come to mind are: bubble wrap, packing peanuts, body guard, witness protection, “my mom.” The **definition of protection is: preservation from injury or harm....** Visualize a bird in a cage being “protected” from the outside world. The definition of **safety is the quality of averting or not causing injury or harm** Visualize a Rainbow Girl who has learned how to be safe AND to protect herself and those around her.

HOW OFTEN DO WE HEAR ABOUT/TALK ABOUT SAFETY? In Nevada, we talk about it often in our daily conversations:

- ✓ No one leaves the building alone after a meeting/event;
- ✓ We know who is picking our girls up;
- ✓ NO phone/electronic-zone in cars;
- ✓ NO texting, phone usage by the driver – *which will be NV law in January 2012*;
- ✓ Lock the buildings once we are all at our meeting;
- ✓ Sunscreen use when we have outdoor activities;
- ✓ Where is your buddy – even to the restroom?

HOWEVER, consider these other important areas we may not discuss or demonstrate as often which are equally important:

- Safety while in an amusement park: buddy system; cell phone number exchange before the event; where is the meeting place if girls are allowed to separate from adults? What is the plan for gathering together periodically during the course of the day – just for a head count? Is that noon and everyone eats together? Or 2 pm for ice cream at the Disney Sweet Shoppe?
- Travel (caravans, designated rest stops, etc.)
- DNA/finger print process. *Hopefully our girls have all participated in the Masonic Youth ID program which will offer this opportunity.*
- Bicycle safety: use of helmets, shoes, etc.
- Health issues: dehydration, tanning, anorexia;
- Kitchen safety – where is the oven mitt? What do we do if there is a fire on the stove in our Temple?

SO HOW DO WE GET A REGULAR AND CONSISTENT PROGRAM OF **SAFETY** INTO OUR ASSEMBLIES. While at this seminar, many options were discussed. **For Nevada**, I would suggest building on this program and instituting a “safety moment” – as a WAA (and GWAA) responsibility. At each meeting, the WA/GWAA, as the momma of the Assembly/Grand Officers, should have something PREPARED to remind us how to be safe. For example, the GWAA will have this moment during the next year as she starts her comments at the end of each OV, talking about seat belt use, cell phones, or some other area untouched in a while. PLEASE work with your WAA to have a similar statement during Good of the Order.. ... on a regular basis. The Grand Deputy MUST approve all topics prior to these MOMENTS.

WE, as adults, need to practice and demonstrate safety every day. When we require the girls to use seat belts, to not use their cell while driving, to not walk to our cars alone after meetings, we need to be following and demonstrating the same. Lead by example – which is what makes us successful. In Nevada, we work hard to not lecture our members about how to behave, talk, dress, etc. – we teach them by our own actions.

Our girls need to focus on gaining valuable information to help us be responsible adults.

ONLINE SAFETY

- ✓ For our girls, the Internet is not scary – but it can be dangerous – as dangerous as a physical confrontation.
- ✓ Cyberbullying: Studies show that 25% of girls between 10 and 18 will experience cyberbullying;
- ✓ Cyberbullying can be as “simple” as rude, hateful, mean comments, something written and then taken the wrong way.

WHAT TO DO:

- ✓ Tell an adult; ADULTS then need to be prepared to ask pertinent questions, and to notify other adults (i.e. the Supreme Officer) and the authorities when warranted;
- ✓ Monitor your Assembly website if there is an interactive portion of it; monitor your Assembly (and your members’) Facebook pages. Most of our Assemblies are using FB in a very pro-active manner to announce meetings, remind girls what to where and how to be prepared. I am please to see that these are “coded” – “Girls, our meeting *this week* will be at 6:30 pm. Be prepared for *balloting*; dress is *short dress*”; *Mary will bring refreshments, call your MA if you have questions – you have her number.*” There is nothing in this message that identifies the LOCATION, the girls’ last names, contact telephone numbers, etc. Only those of us in the “know” – that is “the cool kids” can decipher and fill in the blanks.

GEOTAGGING: For those of us who are always in a learning mode in terms of technology, this is a system whereby cell phones and digital cameras can geotag the location, time and date of pictures placed on the Internet – in any way – specifically on FB. This is a very dangerous situation and often used by predators to gain information they would not otherwise have access to. The site: <http://www.icanstalku.com/> is a great resource for information and instruction regarding geotagging.

This site can search for photos with you in them that have been geotagged and will the provide instruction an how to “untag”.

- ✓ Girls and adults need to disable geotagging from their smart phones and digital cameras.
- ✓ We need to be sure there are no geotags/GPS coordinates on pictures on FB or other social networks;
- ✓ Geotagging can easily be turned back on, for example, if we need to take pictures of an accident, or, heaven forbid, were involved in a kidnapping situation.
- ✓ Chris Lawton, as our Webmaster, will ensure there are no geotags to our website.

FACEBOOK – No matter how much we, as adults, may not appreciate or approve of FB, it is how our girls communicate. We can whine about the fact that FB, texting, etc., are all limiting the way our girls will have “real” conversations, be able to write “real” (non-text abbreviations) in their adult life, but that does not change the reality of their generation. They do communicate on FB so we need to at least help them be safe.

THE BEST RULE REGARDING WHAT SHOULD BE ON FB or an other social network: Unless you are prepared to have your comments on your college applications, job applications, and resume - you should not include it on FB.

- ✓ The reality here is that Human Resource Departments, across the country, in every company and hiring agency, have access to the “back side” of FB and other social networks. They can legally “hack” into “private” and “blocked” areas and read what was meant to be private. Not only CAN they do this, it is becoming common practice prior to accepting students at colleges, offering scholarship opportunities, as well as employment offers. SO, my caution to not post what you don’t want your grandmother to read takes on new and heightened value!
- ✓ Facebook has a “safety” page – find it, read it, use it!
- ✓ Exercise PRUDENT (that is common sense) judgment when posting anything to the Internet anywhere.

BOTTOM LINE: SAFETY HAPPENS WHEN WE ARE PREPARED!
