and Directors are expected for a busy day to review, make decisions, for great fellowship, food and fun.

While our agenda is flexible enough to accommodate whatever comes up, we have been building it all year – if you have an area you want reviewed, clarified, etc... please email it to me now!!!

I will have an “after” event agenda/notes out shortly after Leadership – and the Floor Work document – meant partially as a cut/paste document.

ADVISORY BOARD TRAINING was conducted in Las Vegas (and will be on 1/28 in Reno) with a great turn out. This year the focus was a combination of Advisory Board duties and Youth Protection, including the Supreme Assembly approved DVD, Parents Matter. **Grand Deputies** are responsible for training those who were unable to attend Advisory Board training. **Grand Deputies**, if your adults have not all completed the 2012 Adult Worker Profile, this form must be completed and turned in to me NOW (actually I think I am only missing about 5 profiles!!!). Advisory Board Members who fail to submit a current Profile may not be Installed, and will be relieved of this appointment ... in short order... We simply must know who is working with our girls – this document is as much for the individual adult’s protection as for ours. Additionally, we are continuing our policy to require completion the Supreme Youth Protection Policy Attestation. While the Profile must be completed annually, the Attestation is valid until the policy changes. **ADDITIONALLY**, if you have other parents, grandparents, etc. who are working with the girls who are not currently serving on your Advisory Board, please ask them to also complete a Profile and send it to me....

RAINBOW CAMP registration information was sent to all Mother Advisors and Grand Deputies recently. **ASSEMBLY REGISTRATION AND FEES ARE DUE TO TIMAREE AT ADULT LEADERSHIP**. Please remember we will be celebrating Rainbow Sunday at Camp; the girls need to have their Lambskin Aprons for Sunday morning - note information below from our Grand Officers’ Newsletter.

While at Rainbow Camp, our attire is Rainbow-appropriate casual but if you are **participating** in our Church service, be sure to bring your blue OR purple Nevada Rainbow Polo Shirt and a khaki skirt (and appropriate shoes and nylons) for Sunday morning. If you are a participant, our Grand Chaplain should have been in contact with you by now.

And – remember there is an offering at Rainbow Camp for the benefit of the GWA’s Statewide Service Project....have some serious change with you on Sunday morning.

Our Sunday Service will also be our annual Rainbow Sunday Celebration. Our Adult Leadership has agreed those not participating in the service are welcome to wear Rainbow-appropriate casual wear -- **AND** your **Lambskin apron**. Your Mother Advisors will be collecting all aprons (be sure to put your name in it) when they collect your travel forms; she will distribute the aprons prior to Church on Sunday, collect them again after Church, and return it to you at your next regular meeting. We are very concerned, not about you as an older member, but about our younger members losing their Lambskin Aprons.... this seems a great way to have them all in one place when we need them, and to ensure their safe return

Don't leave home without the appropriate travel and medical releases for each girl **and** adult....attached as a doc to this email.

GRAND OFFICER RECOMMENDATIONS 2012-13

It is time to start the Grand Officer recommendation process. Because your current and Past Worthy Advisors do not receive the Grand Officers' Newsletter, you will need to provide the application form to these girls and may need to review it with them so they understand what is expected of them. Be sure they understand the process of the confidential letter **and the new details I will be looking for.**

While I would expect each current Grand Officer to be responsible about meeting the deadlines to get their materials to the Mother Advisors, Grand Deputies may need to prod some of our girls just a bit. ***Please review the first page of all applications to be sure the information the girls provide is complete – so many times I am left with no zip code, email address, cell number, date of birth or some other relevant***

piece of information. I am inclined NOT to process applications that are turned in incomplete – just like any other employer would!!!

Please note – Mother Advisors and Grand Deputies are asked to write a short (or long as necessary) letter regarding EACH applicant. Please don't group your recommendations into a single document... and please don't tell me the same stuff about each girl. Each of you have a unique experience with each girl – telling me she is “just the sweetest thing and never misses anything important” isn't overly helpful! Help me to make the best officer assignments based on really helpful input!

AND, please see the NEW section about a much more detailed letter I need from those applying for Grand Offices. It is not your job, as MA or GD, to review, correct, punctuate, etc. these letters, but be sure you have met with each applicant so they understand I am looking for much more than “I want to be Grand Love because red is my favorite color.....or my mom made me a new green dress so I think I want to be Grand Immortality.....” I hope that by utilizing this process and building on it for a couple years that we can have, for example, bow projects thought through before appointment are announced, rather than having girls searching and stewing for the first 6 weeks of their appointment – then scrambling to get it approved by their Board so they show up at Leadership *almost* ready to go to work. Our Grand Year starts with Installation – NOT at Leadership!

Except in extremely compelling situations, we do not appoint girls who will be serving as first time Worthy Advisors during Grand Assembly - or who are still in line in their own assembly. If there are extremely compelling reason we should break from this proven tradition, please call me before you give her an application. Our experience has consistently been that girls who are still in the line do less than the job they had planned to do as Worthy Advisor, and focus only on the Grandie part of life - to the detriment of the entire assembly.

As always, we will pick up deserving girls at the last fall visit who have completed their term as WA during the summer.

Be sure to review (and perhaps copy) the relevant pages from the 2009 Mother Advisors' Handbook prior to your April Advisory Board meeting so you are fully informed regarding the process that should be followed. The goal is always to be fair and equitable to each girl.

These thoughts were shared with me by a concerned Board Member several years ago and bear sharing **and** repeating in this Newsletter. They are listed here in no particular order, but should be reviewed and utilized:

- The Grand Deputy is at this specific meeting to proctor the Grand Officer Recommendation process and to assure it goes smoothly and correctly.
- She/he tallies the scores and forwards the results.

- As the liaison to the Supreme Inspector, she/he will write her/his own recommendation and **has a direct voice in the process.**
- She/he (or the Mother Advisor) should report the factual things about each girl: number of service hours, prompting concerns or ritualistic/floor work accomplishments; excused versus not-excused absences;
- She/he should allow the Board to do its work by reaching their own conclusions - which are not difficult if they have been active and participating all year.

TO SUMMARIZE, a GO package should include:

- Application completed by applicant; signed by **both** parents; Advisory Board section completed and signed by all voting members
- Applicant's confidential letter and additional information regarding projects, etc. in sealed envelope
- Letter of recommendation from Mother Advisor or her designee
- Letter of recommendation from Grand Deputy

PROFICIENCY

The Proficiency Degree Program and First Degree questions are attached to this newsletter. Please distribute this information to your girls and adults. Proficiency is "open" for testing through May 1, including Rainbow Camp. Testing will not be done after May 1st unless specifically provided for by the Directors.

GRAND ASSEMBLY 2012

The Grand Assembly 2012 Packages are posted to our website: [Grand Assembly 2012](#)
They are very self-explanatory and provide lots of time within which to meet the deadlines. **Mother Advisors**, please review this material carefully – enlist another member of the Board be responsible for handling registration, meals, collecting money, etc. of Grand Assembly - with your review prior to the deadline. This will help another member learn a new adult task - and will relieve some of the pressure on you as Mother Advisor. Please remember forms must be returned to those designated on the forms by email - checks in the mail immediately thereafter, with a copy of the emailed forms.

We want to eliminate, to the extent possible, changes in Grand Assembly Registrations, rooming selections, meals, etc. It becomes a nightmare for our Registration/Meals people to do their job with any accuracy if assemblies are always changing things. Once rooming assignments are made (and agreed to if that is your Assembly's tradition).... Stick to them! It's a four-night commitment – we should be able to make it work!

Grand Choir material, pattern information, etc., will be distributed at Adult Leadership, along with material for the Adult Leadership Team.

Our **Personal Pages** at Grand Assembly will be housed 4/room on Friday night of Grand Assembly - prior to their Assemblies arriving. Timaree will be their advisor and chaperone and will be responsible for their bed check, etc. This process will add about another \$25 or so to their housing and a couple extra meals....

To that end, please ensure your Personal Pages have this information. Please remind them their **Personal Page Dress fee (\$80) is due to me, payable to Nevada Grand Assembly on February 1.** AND, all Personal Pages need to bring their white, white-soled, strapped SKETCHER-type shoes and undergarments (no hoop or crinoline) to Camp for measurements/fitting.

Calendar - as always, please send me dates important to your assembly to include on our official calendar.... The balance of our calendar begins at page 11. I have been excited to see more and more Facebook announcements about assembly events – and to be included in those. Please remember to keep them informative enough for your members, but GENERIC and NOT informative to those who don't need to know the details. Since last Adult Leadership, I have also seen "Parent Letters" that are being sent to parents for specific assemblies – great work – and thanks, again, for including me. I love to know what the girls are doing. *Our girls belong to the electronic age whether we like it not – help them know what is going on in your group by communicating with them – in their media!!!*

MISCELLANEOUS ----

SUPREME FEES: The fee charged by Supreme is in lieu of assemblies ordering dues cards, parent cards, majority cards, petitions, etc., and many other downloadable forms and documents. It is a continuing cost to offset the maintenance of the site, upgrades, etc., as well as the updating of said time-sensitive forms, and the addition of more documents and tools as we progress over time.

As a refresher, when we came home from Supreme in 2010, I advised all that dues would be going up with the 2011 annual report and that this fee would be charged --- and I encouraged groups to look at their budget, fee for dues, etc. and make changes accordingly. Now that the higher fees to Supreme are "real" I would imagine most assemblies will adjust their dues -- \$10 to Supreme; \$7 to NV Grand -- already most are not charging enough. KNOWING that Supreme's fees would be increasing, our GEB opted NOT to increase per capita -- which used to pay our insurance bill -- not so much now. TO THAT END, you might each be looking at your Assembly by-laws, and revising them to meet what really needs to be assessed to cover these costs through the girls' dues. By-law committees are to be at least two Advisory Board Members and at least two older assembly members. **Once your by-laws are reviews and approved** by the Advisory Board and the assembly – please send me an electronic copy.... I need to review/approve them, and I need to keep them on file – part of that "getting our ducks lined up" process for our jurisdiction.

Summing up

Once again, and always, please know how much I appreciate to each of you for your continued dedication to Nevada Rainbow. While our volunteer salaries in terms of dollars may be missing a few decimal points, truly the real reward is both tax-free and immeasurable - it comes in the form of a little girl who transforms before our eyes into a

Nevada Proficiency Program 2003-2012

First Degree PROFICIENT

- Correctly answering 95 percent of a random selection of questions from the Ritual.
- Correctly write or recite the Rainbow Prayer and Rainbow Dreams
- Correctly recite two flag tributes, other than the Americans Creed (one prompt per tribute is acceptable)

Second Degree PROFICIENT

- Successful completion of First Degree Proficiency.
- Correctly reciting two bow lectures (two prompts per lecture are acceptable)

Third Degree PROFICIENT

- Successful completion of First and Second Degree Proficiency.
- Correctly recite all parts of Opening and Closing, except the prayers (two prompts during opening and two during closing are acceptable)
- Correctly recite the Initiation Prayer (one prompt is acceptable)

Fourth Degree PROFICIENT (revised by Grand Officers 8/03)

- Successful completion of First, Second, and Third Degree Proficiency
- Correctly recite all Line Officer Initiation Lectures (one prompt per office is acceptable)
 - Faith's walking parts
 - Hope's Lecture to the new sister
 - Charity's Pot of Gold Lecturer
 - WAA Lecture to the new sister
 - WA's Lecture to the candidate, **including** the Obligation ("On the altar before you...", "You have now taken the seven ... be of good courage and return.")

Fifth Degree PROFICIENT

- Successful completion of First, Second, Third, and Fourth Degree Proficiency
- Correctly recite Installation Presiding Officer; two prompts acceptable.

Testing for Proficiency will be done during Rainbow Camp, or locally through May 1st. Testing, other than at Rainbow Camp, will be administered by Mrs. Shannon Bunch Jensen in the north, and Ms. Shannon Lawton in the south. Testing during Rainbow Camp will be administered by designated adults who will score the written test and will listen to all ritualistic work. Prompting, only as established above, will be permitted. Those testing will be permitted to review the Ritual for 15 minutes before taking the tests. In the event the test is not passed, Proficiency will be offered again the following year, or in agreement with the Directors of Proficiency.

Girls may complete, in order, one, two, three, four, or all five degrees of Proficiency in one year. Once a girl has successfully completed one step, it does not need to be repeated in subsequent years.

Nevada Proficiency Program
First Degree Proficiency – STUDY GUIDE

These questions should be studied prior to taking the Proficiency Test at Rainbow Camp or other designated times. All the answers to these questions are in the Ritual.

- Who is the Reverend W. Mark Sexson?
- When and where was Rainbow started?
- What is the response to all prayers at Rainbow functions?
- Who may witness the Degrees meeting in Rainbow?
- How many jeweled officers does each assembly have? List them.
- Identify each bow station with its color.
- During Opening, who vouches for all adults present?
- Upon the Worthy Advisor's instruction, which officers "take up" the "word" from all Rainbow Members?
- Why is the Bible placed on the Altar?
- Explain the gavel raps.
- During Initiation, Faith holds which arm of the candidate?
- During Initiation, at what point does the candidate become a "sister" and thereafter referred to as "sister" not "the candidate" or "my friend?"
- During Initiation, the Lambskin apron is tied to which hand of the new Sister?
- During Initiation, who instructs the new sisters in the Secret Work of our Order?
- During Initiation, what is the new sister required to sign?
- What song do we sing AFTER the Bible is closed?
- During Installation, Grand Honors may be given. What two signs are never given during Installation?
- What is the jewel of the Worthy Advisor and what does it represent?
- When is the Mother Advisor given Grand Honors?
- When visiting a Assembly (or attending Grand Assembly), what should each girl have with her?
- During balloting, explain how the Outer Observer enters the room to participate.
- During balloting, how many black balls or cubes must be in the ballot box before a re-ballot is necessary?
- During Initiation, the Mother Advisor instructs the new members to open their Bible each night. What book and chapter is it to be opened to?
- During Initiation, when is "Nearer My God to Thee" sung?

BONUS QUESTIONS

When all Bonus Questions are correctly answered, they may forgive an incorrect answer above, thus raising one's score.

- If the Supreme Inspector or another entitled to Supreme Honors is present at Installation, what sign is given?
- Who are Nevada's current Grand Worthy Advisor, Supreme Inspector, and your Grand Deputy?
- Traditionally, when is Grand Assembly held each year? Where will it be held this year?
